DCMH has been delayed in submitting claims to HUD for DCMH RA Project NY0488L2T041710 because the FY2017 Grant Agreement was not signed by HUD until April 2018 for a grant period that began 02/01/2018. The executed Grant Agreement was returned to HUD by DCMH in May 2018; however as of 08/01/2018 the award was still not reflected in eLOCCS by HUD. DCMH is thus unable to submit claims six months into the grant operating period.

Once the grant is active in eLOCCS, we expect to maintain consistent drawdowns through the end of the grant period.

We hope that for the FY2018 renewal grant, the grant agreement is executed and the grant is active in eLOCCS, before the start of the grant period 02/01/2019.

DCMH has made less than quarterly drawdowns in LOCCS for the current FY2016 grant DCMH Samaritan Initiative NY0815L2T041606 because the staff person responsible left DCMH and then the staff hired as a replacement also left after only a few weeks on the job. We now have stable staff assigned to manage this grant in LOCCS, and we expect to maintain consistent drawdowns through the end of the grant period.

4. Have any Funds been recaptured by HUD for the most recently expired grant term related to this renewal project request? Yes

Explain the circumstances that led HUD to recapture funds from the most recently expired grant term related to this renewal project request.

The FY2016 grant DCMH RA Project NY0488L2T041609 had a remaining balance of \$815,841.27 (11% of the grant award). This is a significant improvement over the \$905,691.34 left unspent from the FY2015 grant. The major reason for the large unspent balance is grant savings due to client share of rent. In addition, the project had an average of approximately 8 unfilled vacancies during the entire operating period (out of 415 households) which is a 98% occupancy rate.

The FY2015 grant DCMH Samaritan Initiative NY0815L2T041505 had a remaining balance of \$69,360.65, including \$66,962.80 in Rental Assistance. The major reasons for the large unspent balance are grant savings due to client share of rent, and that the project averaged 3.93 unfilled vacancies during the operating period (out of target capacity of 10 units). DCMH is working with the Westchester CoC Coordinated Entry to identify eligible DedicatedPLUS homeless persons to bring the project back to full capacity. One new client has entered since the start of the current grant.

Renewal Grant Consolidation Screen

This Rental Assistance project provides 450 housing units to homeless individuals and families diagnosed with and affected by severe mental illness. Individuals served by the project may be experiencing substance abuse issues, developmental disabilities as well as other disabling health conditions. The subrecipients administering this project on behalf of The Westchester County Department of Community Mental Health (DCMH) are The Lexington Center for Recovery, Human Development Services of Westchester, Westhab, The Guidance Center of Westchester, Mental Health Association of Westchester, and Lifting Up Westchester.

All of these subrecipients have extensive experience providing housing and other services to persons with mental health and/or substance abuse issues, and have demonstrated a capacity to deliver quality care. Subrecipients meet regularly with DCMH contract management staff/CoC members to develop and monitor plans to effectively identify and address the needs and issues of the individuals and families served by this project, and to remain aligned with the overall goals of the CoC. DCMH, acting as recipient for this project, conducts annual monitoring visits to ensure adherence to HUD regulations in administering the project. Findings are reported back to the subrecipients and follow-up is conducted as needed.

We will use a Housing First approach to offer eligible participants immediate access to permanent supportive housing.

These services are delivered in partnership with Westchester County DCMH, the subrecipients and numerous mental health, substance abuse, health, vocational, advocacy and school- and community-based programs throughout the county providing supportive services to facilitate success in each individual's recovery process. The project consists of studio, 1BR, 2BR, 3BR, and 4BR units. The project serves to secure and maintain permanent housing in apartment locations of the residents' choosing throughout Westchester County.
